### The Safety Zone with Scott Orban

I would like to share an experience sent to me, by Nick Franco, and his reference back to the MSF class, to inspire more club members about the importance of the MSF class and how it has made a difference for him on the road, either in his car or on his bike.

Last summer, on my way home from work, I stopped at a light on Route 101, and Horseblock Rd — Yaphank. I was in the left lane and the first car at the stop line. I was in my own world waiting for the light to change. Suddenly, I heard a loud crash that startled me. I looked to the left and saw an SUV rolling toward me from the other side of the road. I didn't see the impact to know what precipitated the event, but I was faced with 3000 lbs. of metal coming at me almost in slow motion. I immediately accelerated out of the lane and across the other lane to make a right turn onto Horseblock Rd (west). I called 911 and ran back to the vehicle which was now where I was waiting and had hit the car in the left turning lane that was next to me. The reason I was able to react so quickly was from my MSF training to always leave the bike in gear at a stop light in case you have to make a dash for it. The classes were fantastic.
